

- 1. Vote for one person in each position.
- 2. Tear out, fold, insert this ballot in the envelope marked "For Ballot Only" and seal.
- 3. Place the "For Ballot Only" envelope inside the "Business Reply Envelope" and seal
- 4. Complete the Certificate of Membership on back of "Business Reply Envelope" and sign your name or company name as it is listed on your account (refer to mailing label). The Certificate of Membership must be completed in its entirety in order for the ballot to be counted. A spouse of the member is not authorized to sign ballot.
- 5. Mail or bring to the Western office prior to APRIL 26, 2019.
 - Return only one (1) ballot per Business Reply Envelope.
- Only ballots returned in the official Business Reply Envelope will be counted.

DISTRICT 1


SUSAN ROHLEDER and her husband, Dave, have a farming and livestock operation near Morland. Rohleder
